
















New Radio Host Needed




The New Heights Educational Group is offering another year of enrichment classes for area youth on Saturday's only titled "Saturday Fun Days."

Ingredients

- 1 package spice cake mix (2 layer size)
- 1 package (3 3/4 ounces) instant lemon pudding mix
- 2/3 cup apricot nectar
- 1/4 cup apricot brandy
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 4 large eggs
- 1 cup chopped dates
- 1/2 cup chopped candied cherries
- 1/2 cup chopped candied pineapple
- 1 cup chopped walnuts
- Glaze, optional
- 1 cup sifted powdered sugar
- 2 to 3 tablespoons apricot brandy

An easy, semi-homemade fruitcake recipe with apricot brandy and chopped candied fruits and spice cake mix.



Directions

In a large mixing bowl, combine cake mix, pudding mix, apricot nectar, apricot brandy, and vegetable oil. Beat on medium speed until batter is smooth, about 2 minutes. Add eggs one at a time, beating after each addition. Fold in the chopped fruits and nuts. Turn batter into a generously greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Bake at 350° for 50 to 55 minutes, or until cake tests done. Cool for 15 minutes in the pan, then remove to a cooling rack to cool thoroughly. For best flavor, wrap and store in refrigerator for 24 hours before serving.

Combine 2 to 3 tablespoons of apricot brandy with 1 cup confectioners' sugar; drizzle over fruitcake before serving, if desired.

- 1 package (25.6 ounces) nonfat dry milk powder
- 1 package (15 ounces) hot cocoa mix
- 4 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1 jar (6 ounces) powdered nondairy creamer

Directions

- In a large bowl, combine the first four ingredients; mix well. Store
- in an airtight container. Yield: 17 cups.

Creates 68 serving for a toasty winter!





To prepare hot chocolate: Place 1/4 cup mix in a mug; stir in

3/4 cup boiling water until blended. Yield: 1 serving.
